**The Program**

The TRIO Scholars Program offers supplemental services and core courses to promote the academic achievement of qualified undergraduate students at UNL. Funded by the U.S. Congress, the SSS Program is one of over 900 Student Support Services programs operating on college campuses across the country. The TRIO Scholars Program promotes the retention, leadership development, and graduation of participating students, as well as offering them information about graduate and professional schools.

**Eligibility Requirements**

Participants in the TRIO Scholars Program are selected through an application process. All students selected for the program must be US citizens or permanent residents that demonstrate:

- Academic need for supplemental assistance on the basis of their college GPA (2.90 or below), their enhanced ACT composite score (24 or below), TRIO participant, or Nebraska College Preparatory Academy participant  
**and at least one of the following criteria**
- Financial need (low-income household)\*
- First-generation college student (neither parent has a four-year degree)\*
- A documented disability\*

\*Two-thirds of our participations must meet 2 of the 3 eligibility criteria.

**Services Available**

TRIO Scholars may request a wide range of supportive services, which include the following:

- Free tutoring
- Academic advising
- Career counseling
- Writing and study skill advice
- Financial literacy planning & assistance
- Free checkout of laptops & calculators
- Personal development counseling
- Free printing
- Social and cultural group activities
  - Peer Mentoring Program
  - TRIO Scholars Advisory Board
- Preparation for graduate/professional school
